The Society of Automotive Historians in Britain was formed in 1980 to encourage the research, preservation, recording, compilation and publication of historical material concerning the development of the motor car and related subjects, from inception to the present day.

For its members, the SAHB provides a unique camaraderie and an information exchange network through which other people with similar interests can be located. The Society's membership includes a wide range of individuals with varied interests, professionals as well as private enthusiasts, who all support the preservation of our motoring heritage for future generations to appreciate.

The SAHB was originally formed as a chapter of the American SAH, itself founded in 1969, which has several hundred members from all walks of life in more than twenty-six different countries around the world, but at the AGM of the SAHB on 25 October 2015, members decided that the SAHB should become an independent organisation. In 2020 the Society became a company limited by guarantee registered in England no.12780211.

The SAHB has over 200 members, including some in Europe and overseas, and has links with the AHG in Germany, AISA in Italy, the CONAM in The Netherlands, PHAF in France, and other similar national bodies.

SEMINARS

The Society organises two Seminars each year, in the spring and in the autumn, allowing members to meet face-to-face. Held at different venues around the country, Seminars have members and guest speakers giving presentations that cover a wide variety of motoring-related topics – and usually generate lively debate. The AGM is held in conjunction with the autumn seminar.

PUBLICATIONS

The Society publishes **SAHB Times**, a quarterly newsletter with items about members' activities, short articles, letters, requests for information and classified adverts.
